Sign our Petition!

Recent research by the World Literacy Foundation (January 2012) states that across the world, people who cannot read earn lower salaries and can become more dependent on governments.

The British Dyslexia Association (BDA) suggests using dyslexia friendly teaching as the most effective way of teaching not just for those with dyslexia but **all children**. There are very few children who cannot be taught to read, yet currently 26% of children are leaving primary school without achieving expected levels of literacy, this is unnecessary and leads to many awful social costs.

The BDA has launched a petition to the government requesting that dyslexia training be provided as part of Initial Teacher Training.

100,000 signatures are needed to trigger a debate in Parliament, so if you agree with this petition please sign it, and even more importantly pass it on to anyone you know.
