NEW PATRON

WFDA is pleased to announce that Prof. David McLoughlin has agreed to be one of our patrons. At our recent AGM, David gave an informative talk (see pic.) on Understanding and Managing dyslexia and subsequently agreed to support us.

David is a registered Educational and Occupational Psychologist who provides diagnostic assessments to dyslexic people of all ages, including children. He also provides career guidance for adolescents and adults.

He is a visiting professor at the University of Buckingham, and has acted as an advisor to the British Dyslexia Association. David is a regular contributor to national and international dyslexia conferences and publications, and is the principal author of 'Adult Dyslexia: Assessment, Counselling and Training' (Whurr, 1994) and co-author of 'The Adult Dyslexic: Interventions and Outcomes' (Whurr, 2002).

Famous academics with dyslexia include Albert Einstein and Thomas Edison.

EMPLOYED or UNEMPLOYED

If you're unemployed ask at the job centre to see a Disability Employment Advisor (DEA), check they're a dyslexia specialist. If you explain that you're dyslexic and you believe your difficulties are one of the main factors preventing you obtaining a job they should be able to offer help and guidance and possibly refer you for screening.

Once you're in employment you may qualify for help under the **Access to Work** scheme who may be able to help you with funding to provide such things as: special software, specialised equipment, a person to help you with organisational or time management problems, or even someone to take notes or write letters for you.

Class Criteria and Waiting List

The aim of the WFDA classes is to support local low income families by providing affordable classes which help students to develop self help skills to grow into independent life-long learners.

To achieve this and resolve our literacy and numeracy (NB not touch typing/handwriting) class waiting lists the WFDA Board of Trustees have set out an eligibility priority order for students with dyslexia (only). After much consultation, this has been decided as the fairest policy and WFDA hopes families will understand the reasoning behind it.

- 1 Walthamstow School for Girls pupils
- 2 At least 75% of the students to either attend a state school in LBWF or have a home address in LBWF and attend state school.
- 3 Students from out of borough state schools.
- 4 If the student has already attended for 2 years in either numeracy or literacy class.5 Students from private schools

This policy has been introduced in January 2014 and will be staggered throughout 2014.

For any new literacy or numeracy students it will be with immediate effect.
