This led to him leaving at 16 and starting work at his father's garage. He's commented: "When you've got dyslexia and you find something you're good at, you put more into it than anyone else; you can't think the way of the 'clever' folk, so you're always thinking out of the box."

Eddie Jordan, Formula 1 mogul also has dyslexia. 'Dyslexics adapt and find that they are better at things other than reading and writing. I was always fantastically good at maths. That's probably one of the reasons why wheeling and dealing came easily'. Registered Charity: 802993



Ready for your Driving Test?

For the Theory Test dyslexic candidates are able to listen to the test being read in English through a headset. Dyslexic candidates can also apply to have up to double the standard 57 minutes. You need to request any special arrangements on the online form when you apply for the test. However if you forget to request the voiceover and headset, you could ask for this when you check in at the test centre.

You may be asked for evidence of dyslexia: a letter or report from a professional should explain your reading ability. You will have to phone again for a test date after the report has been processed.

Some people with dyslexia may struggle with comprehension and need someone to explain the question in a different way, known as an Oral Language Modifier. Exam help available!

Due to stress, dyslexia related difficulties such as remembering, comprehension and writing can be made worse in an exam. This can make it particularly difficult for students to demonstrate their ability, knowledge and understanding through one off, timed exams.

Candidates are allowed adjustments to their exams, in accordance with the **Equality Act 2010**. Reasonable adjustments can include extra time, a reader or scribe or coloured exam papers. **Speak early to your child's school about how your child can get this additional help. Exam Support Workshop running on 30 March for families and students in Year 9 and upwards. Book a place with Sheena ASAP.**
