

Heyy! The Fonz gets an OBE!

Happy Days star Henry Winkler has been made an honorary OBE for his work on dyslexia. Diagnosed as an adult, he has toured UK schools over the last 2 years to talk about dyslexia.

"My goal when I started working with children was never to bring accolades on myself, but instead to change how people think about those around them for whom learning is a struggle. I am flattered to have had my work recognised in this manner, and hope to continue showing kids that their learning difficulty isn't a disability."

School support

Are you aware that following the reduction and/or deletion of a number of government/ national grants over the past 18 months Waltham Forest (WF), in common with other local authorities (LA) has had to make significant savings across its public services?

The Educational Psychology (EP) service is one of many services that had its core/central funding reduced with effect from April 2011. However, although the LA is only funding EPs to carry out the statutory work of the service, schools were offered a buy back service from the LA.

Primary schools decided that they wanted to continue to have a full EP service serving their local community and agreed to meet the cost of this from combined budgets. Secondaries, special schools and academies decided to buy in EP services on an individual basis, and many have done this.

Parents may be concerned that where their child's school doesn't buy in the WF EP Service or other EP services, then their children won't have access to additional education support services or EP service.

However this should not be the case. If teachers, SENCos or parents have a concern about a child's academic, developmental, social or emotional progress, there is a duty on the school to investigate (SEN Code of Practice 2001).

Schools are expected to meet with parents to discuss the concerns and support the child's needs using school based provision at School Action. If all in-school strategies and support have been tried, the school must then refer to the appropriate professional or external agency.

The SEN Code of Practice is clear that schools should seek the support of an EP when they have such concerns. It's possible that some WF schools may use private EPs or look to another LA and buy in their EP service.

If your child isn't making progress following additional school support you can request a referal for specialist advice. There should be no difference whether your child is attending a LA maintained school or an academy.
