"The way I write, the way I see the world, is part and parcel of my dyslexia..." These are the words of Benjamin Zephaniah, who alongside being a hugely successful novelist and playwright, is 1 of Britain's most celebrated poets and is in The Times list of the top 50 post-war writers.

One of our students, Alisha Tyler (photo), on being presented with our Jack Petchy Award asked for the prize to be spent on inviting Benjamin to come and give a talk. Amazingly, he made time in his busy life, visiting us at Walthamstow School for Girls where he held a packed audience entranced. Benjamin spoke movingly of his own admiration for Mohammad Ali (a fellow dyslexic). He recalls 'The first time someone told me I was dyslexic; it was like they were swearing at me. I had never heard the word before. It made me a very angry person.'

Subsequently Benjamin has generously agreed to be our **Patron** and stated that 'Many young people have a lot of respect for you, and you have a great understanding of them. This I believe is what has to happen if you are to make a difference'. What It's Like To Be Dyslexic (for those of you who aren't)

Some of the benefits of joining our handwriting class

Your writing is easier to read.

Research has shown that stopping and starting whilst writing can throw the writer off track.

It helps your writing to be clear, fluent, legible and fast.

All letters start on the line so there's no confusion about where to begin the letter.

There is a clear distinction between capital letters and lower case.

Writers are less likely to reverse letters which are typically difficult such as b/d.
